# Program: CRS & Floodplain Coordinator

- Joint position with Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution Sea Grant and Barnstable County's Cape Cod Cooperative Extension
- Mission
  - Get all interested towns into CRS; improve ratings as much as possible
  - Assist with floodplain management & NFIP regs
  - Improve flood resiliency overall
- Items of note:
  - 2019 CRS Award for Excellence
  - 2017 James Lee Witt Local Award for Excellence in Floodplain Management from ASFPM
  - NFIP reauthorization bill
  - Coastal Resilience Specialist

## Regional CRS Management








- National Flood Insurance Program discount opportunity
- Flood insurance discounts in exchange for actions that reduce flood risk
- Improves flood resilience
  - · Incentive for resilience
  - Improves building code enforcement & awareness
  - Open space preservation
  - Public education
  - Ideas for advanced floodplain management



#### Status

- 9 CRS towns
  - 5 new
  - Class 8: 2
  - Class 7: 5
  - Class 6: 1
- 4 applications in progress
- Nearly \$500,000 annual savings (note: RR2.0 has made this a guessing game)
- Nearly 4,000 policyholders



- CRS User Group/trainings







- Basic floodplain management assistance






## Regional Floodplain Assistance









## Regional FPM

- Review ECs before Certificate of Occupancy
- Technical assistance to Building,
   Conservation, Planning, community boards
- Technical assistance to local contractors, surveyors, engineers
- Trainings, CFM credits/guidance
- Flood insurance/mitigation questions
- Public outreach
- Partner with Homebuilders and Remodelers Association, Cape Cod and Islands Association of Realtors, local lenders

### Summary: By the Numbers

## Barnstable County Floodplain Management Program since 2015




- People reached: 10,000
- Certified Floodplain Managers®: tripled
- Grant \$ brought into County: \$750,000
- \$ saved for residents and businesses on flood insurance: \$3.2 million

- Understand local circumstances


- Connect local communities to state and federal resources
