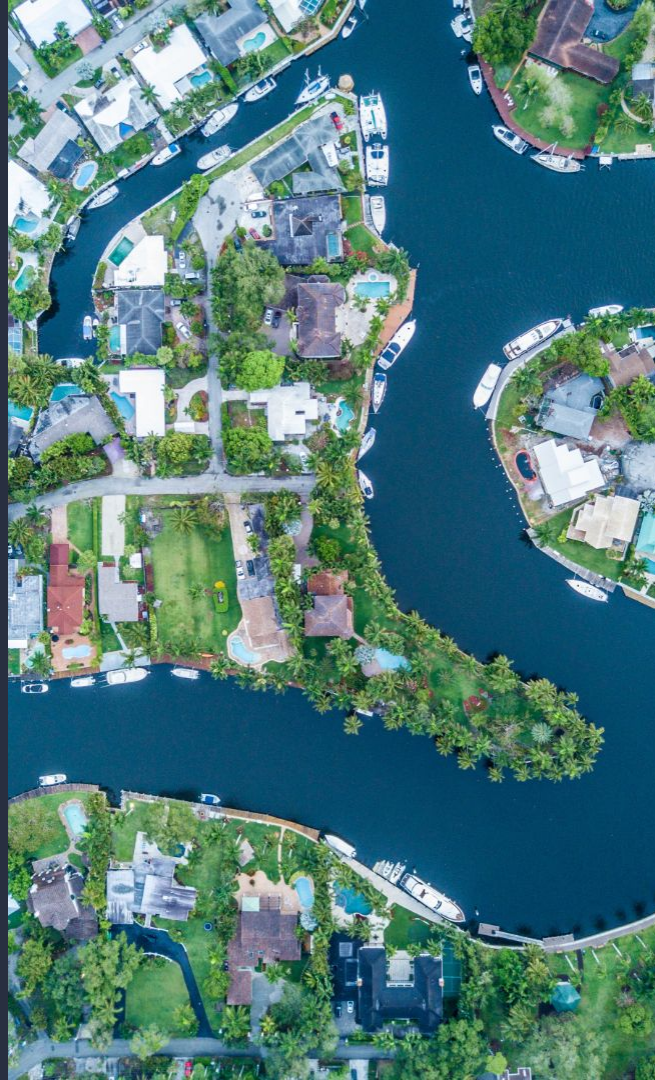

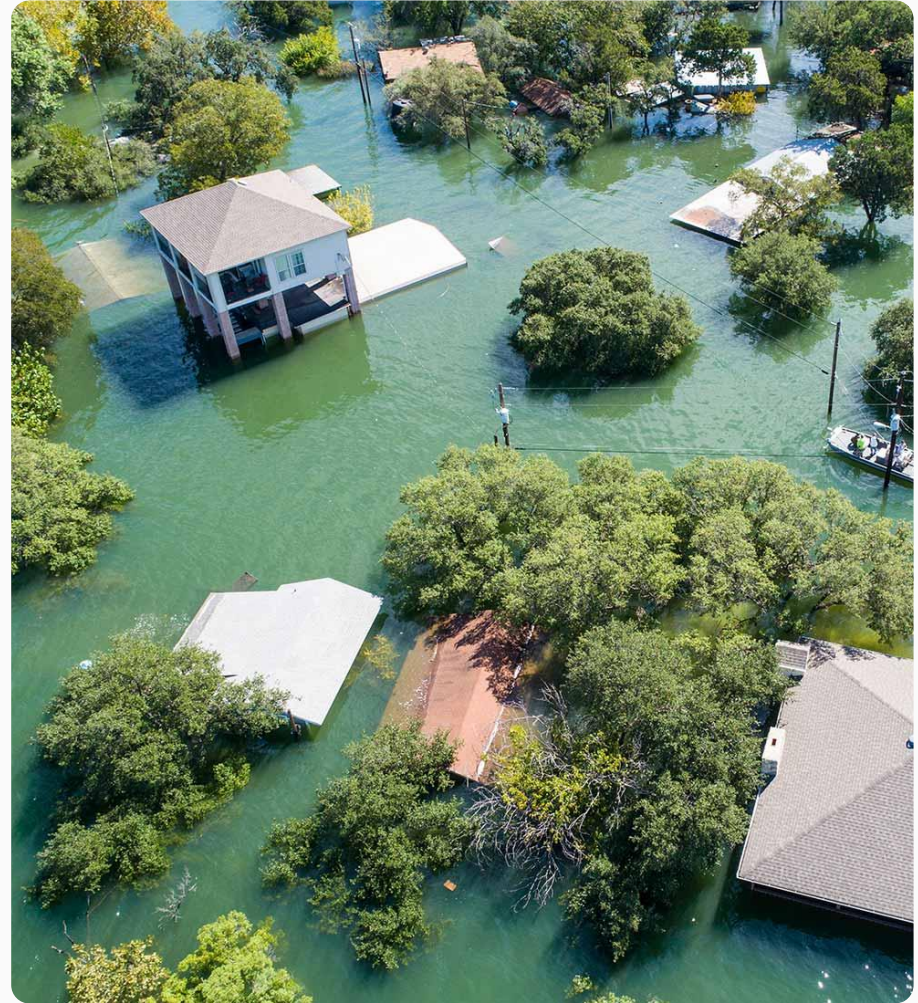

Household-Level Damages

Accelerate PDAs and SDEs with mobile field assessments, auto-updating dashboards, and property-level damage tracking.



Debris & Resource Management

Track debris pickups, tickets, generators, light towers, and emergency equipment with real-time status updates and automated return reminders.



Vulnerable Population Management

Maintain Access and Functional Needs registries so emergency teams can identify residents requiring additional support during response and recovery.



Public Infrastructure & Critical Assets

Map damaged roads, bridges, utilities, lift stations, and stormwater pumps while tracking inspections and maintenance activity.



Grant Management

Store worksheets, cost shares, documentation, and recovery records in one centralized, audit-ready system.



Public Communication & Outreach

Share updates through a public portal, collect resident submissions, and automate mailings and notifications to keep communities informed.

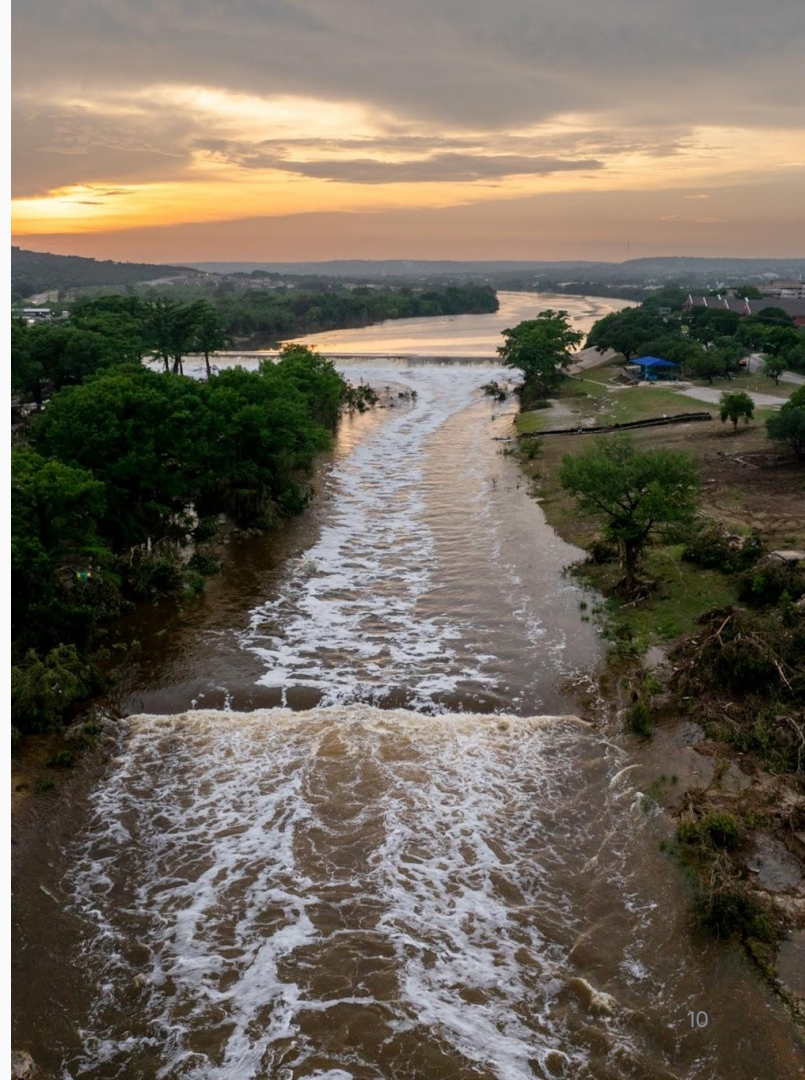
Storm preparedness matters more than ever.

The Disaster Recovery Landscape Is Changing

- Communities can no longer rely on FEMA alone to drive recovery efforts
- Federal funding and reimbursement processes are becoming more uncertain, delayed, and documentation-driven

What This Means for Local Governments

- Communities need to proactively track and document damages from day one
- Strong local processes for assessments, inspections, photos, and reporting are critical to securing recovery funding



Damage assessments and debris management are critical.

Current Challenges

- Manual processes and disconnected records slow recovery efforts
- Incomplete documentation can create issues with reporting
- Tracking debris removal, inspections, and damages across teams is often difficult during fast-moving events

What Communities Need

- Standardized damage assessment workflows
- Centralized debris tracking and documentation
- Real-time field data collection, photos, and reporting
- Clear record keeping to support recovery funding and audits



Preparing for the disaster life cycle is critical for all communities, especially at-risk communities.

Recover faster

Being prepared enables a more efficient response and aids in expediting the recovery process.

Avoid compliance issues

Minimize compliance issues by ensuring your team is equipped to meet regulatory requirements during a crisis.

Unlock grant funding

Swiftly demonstrate readiness and eligibility, expediting the process of accessing and unlocking grant funding.
